The show *Il Viaggio di Federico* by Luca Capuano will open at the Bologna Urban Center exhibition space on Friday September 14, 2012. The show will feature a series of photographs captured by Luca Capuano on the Bologna surrounding environment: the photographer combines real or artificial images, unpublished figures, signs of life, landscapes as “tales of the world”.

The project originates from a chance encounter: the double portrait of the Dukes of Urbino, Federico da Montefeltro and Battista Sforza, installed in a small anonymous hotel dedicated to Piero Della Francesca. The photographer’s attention is suddenly attracted by the famous painting reproduction and focuses on its naturalistic background landscape.

In that idealized and uncontaminated nature, as influenced by the Humanism of the time, Luca Capuano investigates the intersections with the contemporary scene. By assuming Federico’s identity, during his itineraries around the city, he explores differences and similarities, collects details of real or duplicate figures. By keeping on his mind the landscape of Piero Della Francesca painting, the transfer on the Duke of Montefeltro identity allows him to gather objective images of abandoned sites, surrounding environments, black and white portraits, which turn into tales on the moment of the exhibition set up. The images acquire their meaning in the full project, they create unexpected stories by depicting universal concepts of life and death, in a continuous balance between tradition and contemporaneity, reality and fiction.

On show a part of the large series of photographs composing the full project included in the upcoming book *La storia di Federico*, published by Logos.

Luca Capuano was born on 1974 in Bologna, where he lives and works.
